From the General Manager

Cairns Hockey had a positive year delivering many successful events, programs and competitions. This success was thanks to our hard-working clubs, employees, board and volunteers. Cairns Hockey is extremely fortunate to have so many valuable people working together for the benefit of hockey in Cairns. Cairns Hockey developed and delivered their new strategic plan that outlines five key priorities. Upon review of the 2021 year, I address the below achievements within those priorities.

Priority 1 Build Hockey

Cairns Hockey in collaboration with the infrastructure advisory group developed the Cairns Hockey Infrastructure plan. Thank you to Nick Hardy and the Infrastructure team for all their hard work. Cairns Hockey presented the infrastructure plan and key priorities to Cairns Regional Council, State government and Federal Government. Cairns Hockey developed a maintenance management plan and are in the process of developing the hockey regional plan. Cairns Hockey's facility requires constant maintenance and in 2021 we were required to replace 14 lights on the turfs, with a huge thank you to Mark Fry and NQEA for your great assistance. Cairns Hockey renovated the grandstands, tree's removed, fencing upgrade, addressed numerous plumbing leaks, replaced a multitrobe in the water tanks, installed security cameras, upgraded the PA system and purchased a new ride on mower. Thank you to Ray Bolton and the facilities team for your maintenance efforts and ensuring our facility was capable and ready to deliver our events.

Priority 2 Play Hockey

Cairns Hockey operations team have developed the Play hockey plan that will drive successful outcomes to achieve our strategic objectives.

Cairns Hockey also delivered our Hookinzhockey programs at 34 Cairns schools and developed school to club hockey programs. We developed and delivered 2 school carnivals, The BDO Primary and Secondary carnivals. These carnivals were a great success with 33 teams playing in the primary carnival and 14 teams in the secondary carnival. We had 150 participants engage in the hockey holiday programs in April and July. We had an increase in junior participation numbers in 2021 and this was reflective of the Play Hockey plan focus on junior recruitment and the motivation of Mili Arrotea and our Junior advisory group. Thank you to Karen and the Junior Advisory Group team for your hard work and support of Cairns Hockey junior program. Thank you to Mikala Duda and Saints Hockey club for supporting our Southside junior program at Pezzutti Park.

A little bittersweet in 2021 as we farewell our development officer Mili Arrotea. Mili and her partner are off to live in Tasmania. Mili has been an extremely valuable team member of Cairns Hockey and we will miss her. We wish her and Richard all the best for the future. Cairns Hockey will welcome a new development officer, Keegan Popowski. Keegan will join Cairns Hockey from 17th January 2022. He is from Tasmania and is passionate about hockey having played since he was 5 years old. He has a Health and Physical education degree and a graduate certificate in sports management. He is a level 2 hockey coach and has great experience coaching juniors and seniors. We look forward to welcoming Keegan to the CHA team. Cairns Hockey Development and performance programs were delivered to over 550 participants. 286 players participated in the Cairns Hockey representative programs for both outdoor and indoor hockey. Thank you to all the wonderful and dedicated, coaches, managers, umpires and technical officials that volunteered their time to support our representative program and players. We cannot deliver this program without your support. Thank you to Glen Seivers and the performance and pathways advisory group, and Tanya Findlay and the officiating advisory group for your hard work in 2021. Thank you to our CHA Representative program sponsors Smartline - Michele Annison, James Cook University and NQEA-Mark Fry. A huge thank you to our gold sponsor Hockey World, Sam, Terry and Jacqui for ensuring the Hockey World shop was open and serviced at every opportunity possible for our members.

Wynand Volschenk joined Cairns Hockey in August 2021 as the Hockey Performance and Game Service manager and since his arrival he has hit the ground running. He ensured the successful delivery of the outdoor winter season competition and the indoor hockey season competition. He worked closely with Janice Noonan, Terry Brodin and the competition advisory group and Rhylee Pendrigh and the indoor advisory group. Thank you to all the members of our Cairns Hockey advisory groups. You all work extremely hard throughout the year to support CHA operations team and our members. Our Indoor hockey season was delivered at two locations with a southside, and CBD location offered. Cairns Hockey will offer an Indoor Season at the start of the year in 2022, all information has been shared with our members and on our social media platforms. Wynand is in the process of delivering our CHA Academy programs with the Blue and Gold Academies to further develop athletes and prepare our Hockey QLD squad athletes. These academies will continue in the off season and through to February 2022. The All Stars is also being promoted for delivery in January 2022, after the great success of the competition in 2021 (160 players involved). Cairns Hockey welcomed three sponsors on board, and we thank Jake Simonis Fencing, Lane Orthodontics, and The Cotton Club for their continued support of the All Stars. Our officiating advisory group developed and delivered the umpire/officiating academy program that saw good outcomes with many umpires and technical officials being accredited and mentored. Many of these volunteers supported Cairns Hockey and our representative programs by travelling away to umpire and tech officiate. Cairns Hockey six a side was played all year with over 30 teams in term 1 and 4 and 8-10 teams in terms 2 and 3. This opportunity was provided for players that could not participate in the traditional winter season competition and allowed them to still be engaged and play hockey.

Priority 3 Lead Hockey

Cairns Hockey in consultation with our members, clubs, board, employees and stakeholders, developed and delivered our new Strategic Plan 2021-2024. Cairns Hockey operational plan is in draft phase to be finalised by early 2022. Cairns Hockey board redrafted the Constitution. This has been presented to the clubs and members for adoption at the next AGM January 20th, 2022. CHA operations team, advisory groups and the board have worked hard to develop the Infrastructure and Play hockey plans to drive successful outcomes to achieve the objectives outlined in our strategic plan.



Cairns Hockey is in a financially strong position. Cairns Hockey obtained grants to support infrastructure development and facility maintenance.

Cairns Hockey also welcomed 6 new sponsors on board in 2021. Cairns Hockey operations upgraded their website and improved their communication platforms. This is a space we will focus on in 2022 to improve communications with our members and stakeholders. In 2021 we introduced a new payment gateway option for registration fees. This was developed to support the clubs by reducing the workload and responsibility for club treasurers.

The implementation and development of the Hockey Performance and Game Committee (HPGS Committee) which included the Club presidents, a club plus 1, and the chairs of the advisory groups worked well to ensure the successful efficiency of communication. Thank you to our club presidents, Paul Dennis, Vicki Sparkes, Kate Borger and John Winkle for leading your club committees and your commitment in 2021. A special thank you to both Paul and Kate as they will finish their tenure as club presidents. You have both been a real pleasure to work with. Thank you to the Cairns Hockey Board, John Watts (President), Sonja Noonan (Vice- President), Michele Annison (Secretary), Cheryl Overlack (Finance Director) and Gary Smith for your leadership of Cairns Hockey. The strategic direction of Cairns Hockey is strong, positive and inclusive.

Priority 4 Celebrate Hockey

Cairns Hockey in 2021 successfully delivered many events. We hosted and delivered:

- · Great Barrier Reef Masters
- · Open School Boys championships
- 60's master's Carnival
- · Cairns Hockey winter season presentation night
- · Annual Rene Archer Indigenous Round

A huge thank you to the CHA operations team, Aspire to be deadly team, Clubs and Cairns Hockey volunteers for your support and hard work to deliver these events. We received great feedback from all events, and it was from this success we were able to secure the two national events for 2022. Cairns Hockey in 2022 will host and deliver:

- U18 Male and Female National championships (11-day event) in April 2022
- Masters Women National Championships (12-day event) in September 2022

Priority 5 Support Hockey

Cairns Hockey successfully delivered the Aspire to be deadly program to over 30 schools from Thursday Island, in Cape York and the gulf and throughout Cairns. The Aspire to be deadly team worked tirelessly to deliver the program to our schools to promote healthy outcomes with our lead well, live well and learn well empowerment program. The collaboration of the aspire to be deadly program with our clubs is positive and strong. The success of the program and its positive outcomes is due to the hard work of Julie McNeil, Wes Ferns and the aspire to be deadly team. Cairns Hockey operations teams was proud to support the Aspire to be deadly team throughout 2021 and we are excited for the future outcomes this program will deliver in 2022-2023.

Aspire To Be Deadly

One of the key strategic pillars within the Cairns Hockey Strategic Plan identifies high level of community engagement and social responsibility through Cairns Hockey community and our marquee program in this landscape is Aspire to be Deadly and it is designed to use hockey as a vehicle to drive positive social change.

The model program links participation with Live Well Learn Well Lead Well - education, well-being and leadership programs and identifies hockey as a gender equal, inclusive, and culturally safe program. Unlike mainstream participation programs, recruiting players into club is not the program's primary consideration but it has been very pleasing to report in 2021 that indigenous club membership is increasing and the strengthening of communication and awareness within the clubs and Aspire to be Deadly drives this positive outcome.

Cairns Hockey began developing Aspire to be Deadly in 2015 well before the challenges of the COVID19 focused world but the pandemic has shown the importance sport plays in a community recovery. Aspire to be Deadly plays the role supporting inclusion, engagement, connectivity in repairing some of the torn social fabric caused by COVID19.

Cairns Hockey Aspire to be Deadly is supported through Commonwealth Government NIAA and has built strong and diverse community partnerships to reinforce the importance of a holistic and inclusive approach in the modified delivery of hockey activities and supporting across Torres Strait, Cape York, Gulf Savannah and Cairns and Tableland regions.

Aspire to be Deadly engages at risk and vulnerable indigenous young women and girls in disadvantaged environments and looks to engage with school, support agencies, hockey clubs, partners and sponsors, and family to provide a program that builds self-worth, builds self-confidence, provides tools to support positive decision-making, and challenges the participants to increase school attendance, reduce anti-social behavior, make better well-being choices, and encourages participants to become leaders.

HIGHLIGHTS IN 2021

- The Aspire Schools Program was delivered into 25 primary school programs and 5 Secondary Campuses across Cairns, Cape York, Torres Strait Islands and Gulf Savannah regions during 2021.
- Actively supporting 5 secondary schools Grade 7,8 and 9 transition programs across the identified remote and regional regions with aa total 85 students in these transition program of which 76 are indigenous.
- National curriculum aligned programs using Aspire supported resources continue being delivered with significant success in remote and regional
- · Continue to advance and strength collaborations and partnerships with additional well-being and leadership partners coming on board. Cape York Girls Academy is a new partner in Deadly 5's as well as the Empower Me Program.
- Through the Aspire to be Deadly Program, over 3000 indigenous young people and families from grades 3-9 across Primary and Secondary Schools were introduced to, participated in, and were mentored as part of in support of the LIVE WELL LEARN WELL LEAD WELL Programs. These programs were delivered across a region larger than the combined are of Victoria/Tasmania and ACT.
- 4 additional community collaborations delivering education/training/mentoring and participation.
- Over 38 indigenous young people including 31 indigenous young women and girls participated in the integrated SCHOOL TO CLUB Program offered through Aspire and these young people and their families played mainstream club hockey and summer 6's.
- 31 indigenous young women were supported through the Aspire indigenous mentor program and linked with the Aspire Schools Learning Resource, workshops, transport support and the availability of the Aspire Hockey Hub and Yarning Place.
- Community Support continues as does the ongoing engagement with family. Over 73% of these parents and supporters actively supporting the voung women and girls are female.
- Delivered pathway performance program support with 20 Aspire Schools participants attending representative school hockey trials with 7 Aspire students being selected in regional teams across all identified regions.

- · Developing ACE Aspire Centre Excellence (Hockey Program) for delivery in Term 4 including workshops, specialised coaching skills and game sciences, strategies, and performance as part of a Cairns Hockey collaboration and support to grade 7 and 8 transition support. Collaborated with supportive coaches to align with program needs.
- Delivered 3 team building workshops, mental health support programs and healthy habits program incorporating nutrition, hygiene, and well-being habits for life.
- Delivery of inaugural Rene Archer Indigenous Round and community support, Strong feedback and confirmation this will
- Delivered a new and improved Gulf Savannah Hockey Program producing strong outcomes around all aspects of LIVE WELL LEARN WELL LEAD
- Delivered 2 remote communities Hockey Carnival modified to meet COVID 19 restrictions. This program was embraced by the community.
- Delivery Deadly 5's event aligning with NAIDOC in June 2021.
- Developing digital education and support platforms across remote and regional school delivery to support ASPIRE SCHOOLS LIVE WELL LEARN WELL LEAD WELL.
- · Live Well Learn Well Lead Well Mentor and Support Program delivered by Olympians Savannah Fitzpatrick and Tim Howard.

Cairns Hockey has strengthened its relationship with Oceania Hockey through the Hook in4 Health Program delivered by Aspire to be Deadly, increased its engagement with Hockey Australia across indigenous program support and has been recognized through FIH as a leading sport for development program.

Everything mentioned above is due to the hard working Aspire to be Deadly Team. Julie McNeil leads the team comprising Wes Ferns, Jess Fatnowna, Sawadu Tabuai, David McNeil and Stephanie Bonel and supported by Lisa Fatnowna, Sarah and Bella Cochran and Carleah Flinders. Aspires' success is because the team works. Thanks to everyone in the team and thank you to our partners, schools, sponsors, clubs and volunteers, because we know and appreciate that it takes a village.

#REPRESENT ACADEMY

October 2021 saw the return of the Cairns Hockey academy rebranded to #REPRESENT ACADEMY. The academy follows a two stream pathway being the Blue Development and the Gold Performance academies.

The Blue academy is designed to help improve players within the Cairns region to better their skills and game awareness and to #REPRESENT Cairns Hockey to the best of their ability. This academy aims to both increase Cairns Hockey competitiveness at State Championships but also help improve the ability of players to be selected into QLD squads after State Championships. A total of 52 athletes are currently involved in the Blue academy.

The Gold academy is designed to bridge the gap for identified athletes to make the step up into Hockey Queensland teams. This academy is designed to help prepare the athletes for Hockey Queensland Trials in their respective age divisions. Currently, a total of 29 athletes are involved in the Gold academy. Both the Gold and Blue Academy gives opportunity for coaches at various levels to become part of the coaching and help develop their knowledge and coaching skills.

The Academy further provided opportunity for Hockey Queensland High Performance Manager Matt Wells to work with coaches and athletes within the academy. Matt Wells started by giving individual feedback to coaches assisting in the U13 Blue academy, followed by a coaches workshop attended by 27 coaches and players. Matt Wells shared his knowledge on team cultures and expectations of players, presented on different playing structures and positions used within Hockey at a national and international stage.

2020 End of Season Report... 'The culture of our association is positive and encouraging and our Junior Committee remains fervent in uniting our efforts for the betterment and enhancement of junior hockey in our region with the 2021 season looking set to be one of opportunity, collaboration and growth'.

2021 End of Season Report... mission achieved!

The Junior Advisory Group alongside the incredible Mili and amazing crew at CHA have dedicated themselves throughout the season to the successful running of the P Competition. From the beginning of the year the Clubs supported the opportunities that CHA presented to the community and over 1500 children were engaged in our sport. Coming from the perspective that we were rebuilding from a COVID impacted 2020 season, the participation in these opportunities was a fantastic result.

2021 Sign On Day

21 schools and 1551 students were visited in T1.

208 participants attended Holy Cross, Pezzutti Park and Cairns Hockey events. 59 of those 208 registered to play hockey in the P Competition 2021 season. From the commencement of the season in April, we were pleased to see that everyone's hard work during the Term 1 recruitment period had resulted in a 30% increase in the P12 and P56 registrations and P34 had also slightly increased from the 2020 season.

These numbers enabled us to deliver a north and south side P12 and P34 competition again at Pezzutti Park and CHA. The south side teams joined in to the north side competition at the beginning of July and we all finished the P12 and P34 season combined. We finished our P12 and P34 season with a dress up theme of 'who you want to be when you grow up!' and this was an awesome way end to our 2021 season!

CHA delivered some incredible opportunities to the community throughout the winter season to continue engaging new and existing players to our sport. In doing so, many assistant coaches were brought in and upskilled and the relationship between schools and CHA has grown. These opportunities included taking hockey to the schools in After School Programs, attracting kids to the CHA North Cairns facility with the School Holiday Clinics (which were extremely popular and very well attended) and additionally offering a Development Program and Summer 6's game format to target new and beginner players from 7 - 14 years of age.

After School Programs

7 x 'After School Programs' were delivered in St Michael's, Redlynch SS, Freshwater SS, St Joseph's, St Andrew's, Holy Cross and OLHOC primary schools.

156 students participated in the program with 14 assistant coaches involved.

School Holiday Programs at Cairns Hockey

2 days were offered in the April school holidays and 3 days were offered in the June/July break. 172 participants over the 5 days with 9 assistant coaches were involved.

Development Programs at Cairns Hockey

Development Program + Summer 6's in Term 1 + Term 4.

30 participants attended with 15 beginner players and 2 assistant coaches involved.

- Development Program Term 2 + Term 3.

19 participants attended with 9 beginners and 2 assistant coaches involved.

It was exciting to see that 3 participants chose to register to play in the competitive season.

Mili, the team at CHA and the many Club volunteers have worked tirelessly to create and strengthen our relationship within our region's primary schools. Due to this massive effort, CHA was able to offer a primary school carnival that incredibly enticed 30 teams to attend. This event was very well received and I believe will be even bigger in 2022. We would like to thank the many volunteers that offered their assistance to make this day such a great success!

A trial and selection process offered to our registered U11 and U13 players presented an opportunity to represent our region in hockey. It was an exceptional effort to send teams away in both age groups and we offer our sincere thanks to all of the players, coaches and managers, umpires and officials, families and friends for attending and supporting these annual events.



Our U11 and U13 Cairns Representative Teams

- 1 x Boys and 2 x Girls Under 11 teams travelled to Mackay.
- 3 x Under 13 Girls teams travelled to Gympie for the State Championships.
- 2 x Under 13 Boys teams travelled to Townsville for the State Championships.

In addition to the State Championships, our U11 and U13 representative sides travelled to Townsville to participate in the Hawthorn Shield for a fantastic weekend of hockey.

In a great initiative, CHA delivered two coaching sessions which were open to parents and the P12 and P34 Club coaches. Both the north and south side facilities each received a session. These were offered directly after the P12 and P34 games had finished on a Friday evening to capitalise on attendance and were very well received. It would be great to offer something similar to this again in the 2022 season.

With the introduction of the Blue Academy, CHA sought to provide a unique opportunity in the off-season to improve players hockey skills in the Under 13 age group. These sessions have over 30 participants attend each week and include the upskilling of interested Club and representative coaches and have provided inspiring opportunities to meet visiting international players and coaches as well.




